**<Background or Introduction>** ← 11pt, Times New Roman bold

The purpose of introduction is to provide sufficient background information to allow the reader to clarify and understand the results of the present study without referring to previous publications on the topic.

**<Materials and Methods>** ← 11pt, Times New Roman bold

Selected papers will be published to be included in the Symposium proceedings. All quantitative measurements should be made in SI units.

**1.** The font used throughout the paper is Times New Roman. The abstract size is A4 (i.e., 210×297mm), single-column format with a 3 cm margin at the top, a 2 cm margin at the bottom, 2 cm margins on the left and right. Lines are single spaced, justified at both margins. So the maximum body size of the abstract is 170 x 237 mm.

**2.** The title of the abstract should be in 12 pt bold and be centered.

**3.** Author names should be in 11 pt bold. Full name is used for publication with given name followed by family name. Multiple author names are alphabetically indexed as superscript, as shown.

Author affiliations should be in 10 pt italic with regular line spacing. The body of the text should commence 2 lines below the last address. The address for correspondence for the main author is to be included at the end of the paper following the references.

**4.** The body of the text of the submission is a set of body text paragraphs defined as follows:

10pt Times New Roman font, · Single space, defined as 10pt, There is no indentation for the first line

**<Results>** ← 11pt, Times New Roman bold

Tables are sequentially numbered in numeric fashion with the table title and number above the table. Tables should be followed by a line space (10pt). Elements of a table should be single spaced; however double spacing can be used to show groupings of data or to separate parts of the table. Table column headings should be in 10pt bold.

**<Conclusions>** ← 11pt, Times New Roman bold

All submitted papers will be evaluated by three independent reviewers. Evaluation will focus on the originality of the submission, the contribution to the medical informatics field, the clarity of exposition and the adequacy of references to relevant international researches.
