He is the Chair of the IUIS Quality and Assessment Committee and Co-coordinator (with Professor Edward Chan) of the ICAP (International Consensus on ANA Patterns). He is a former Chair of the Autoantibody Standardizing Subcommittee (www.autoab.org) affiliated with the IUIS. He serves in the editorial board of a variety of journals in the area of autoimmunity and rheumatology. His research interests have focused on studies of the fields of autoantibodies, rheumatoid arthritis, systemic lupus erythematosus, systemic sclerosis, capillaroscopy, and molecular biology of autoantigens and autoimmune rheumatic diseases. More recently he concentrated on the field of autoantibody testing and standardization.
