



## **Young-Hoon Jeong**

Dr. Young-Hoon Jeong became a full professor in Gyeongsang National University Hospital, and have served as a director of cardiovascular center at Changwon Gyeongsang National University Hospital since 2016. He received his Ph.D. degree in 2009. Then he worked as a visiting scholar in Thrombosis Research Center, Sinai hospital in Baltimore between 2010 and 2012. He is a current vice president of Asian society of cardiology, vice chairperson in Platelet-Thrombosis Research Group and Chairman of Arrangement Committee in Asian-Pacific Society of Thrombosis and Hemostasis 2020, and works as a core member of ESC Working Group of Thrombosis. He won the “Highest Ranking Abstract” at the 2016 ACC’s Annual Scientific Sessions and “Young Author Achievement Award” at the 2010 ACC’s Annual Scientific Sessions. His research mainly focuses on pharmacodynamic study of blood thinner, the concept of vulnerable blood as well as race-tailored antithrombotic treatment. Especially, he invented the concept of “East Asian Paradox” to indicate the different therapeutic window of platelet reactivity. He published multiple papers in renowned journals such as New England Journal of Medicine, Lancet, and JAMA. He was a main writer of “2018 update of expert consensus statement on antiplatelet therapy in East Asian patients with ACS or undergoing PCI”.
